- 1. **Title of the Practices**: a) The Celebration of Desi Samskriti Utsav Day.
  - b) The Group System.
- 2. **Goal**: a) Not only developing in our students an awareness about out the Desi culture but also making them keen in practising the principles of the Desi culture in their lives, without being mechanically carried away by the western culture.
  - b) Developing in students the qualities of sociability, responsibility, and leadership among the students.
- 3. **The Context**: a) Inculcation of the tenets of Desi culture among students.

- 4. The Practice: a) Celebration of Desi Samskriti Utsav Day is meant for all the students of the college. Every *Desi Samskriti Utsav Day* has been a milestone in the history of our institution. During 2016-17, each class of students was given the task of exhibiting the cultural and traditional practice of the famous festival, UGADI, which marks the beginning of the new year.
