Annexure I

We have been following many best practices in our college for the benefit of the students, institution, and society as a whole. Since only the best two practices are to be described here, we have chosen:

- 1. The Celebration of Desi Samskriti Utsav Day, and
- 2. The Group System.
- 1. **Title of the Practices**: a) The Celebration of Desi Samskriti Utsav Day.
 - b) The Group System.
- 2. **Goal**: a) Not only developing in our students an awareness about out the Desi culture but also making them keen in practising the principles of the Desi culture in their lives, without being mechanically carried away by the western culture.
 - b) Developing in students the qualities of sociability, responsibility, and leadership among the students.
- 3. **The Context**: a) Inculcation of the tenets of Desi culture among students.
 - b) Addressing the grievances of all the students.
- 4. The Practice: a) Celebration of Desi Samskriti Utsav Day is meant for all the students of the college. Every *Desi Samskriti Utsav Day* has been a milestone in the history of our institution. During 2017-18, each class of students was given the task of exhibiting the cultural and traditional practice of the famous festival, UGADI, which marks the beginning of the new year. All the students participated in this festival without any hesitations. This occasion gave a platform to our

students to understand the different food items and dresses used, and the cultural practices that are observed during the celebration of the festival.

b) Six groups are selected irrespective of the class and the course. Each group is named after some good quality or after the Jnanapeetha awardees.

Each group is assigned with the task of writing the *Thought for the Day* every day, and announcing it in the daily prayer.

5. **Evidence of Success**: Both the best practices have yielded good results.

a) The Celebration of Desi Samskriti Utsav Day has been responsible for a great

increase in the cultural/traditional awareness of our students and a sense of

oneness in them in spite of differences.

b) The group system has resulted in creating a sense of service, good social

relationship, and friendship among all the students irrespective of colour, creed,

caste, class differences, and distinctions.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required: No problems have been

encountered so far in observing these best practices. The resources required for

these practices are used from the college account.
